









Pakistan's Climate and Disaster Risks



- Among the top 10 countries worldwide most affected by climate change and natural hazards.
- Extreme pressure on food production and security.
- Decline in labor productivity due to extreme heat.
- Negative impact on riverine ecology, water security, and hydropower production due to precipitation change and declining water availability.
- Salinization of soil and coastal erosion due to sea-level rise.
- Worsening monsoon floods and landslides due to glacial melt in the northern mountains.

Sindh Emergency Rescue Service (Rescue 1122)



Imperative for an Emergency Rescue Service in Sindh



Siloed government structures

- Fire fighting services managed by local governments.
- Ambulance services operated by private organizations.
- Difficult and complex coordination amongst departments.

Increasing disasters

- Climate induced extreme weather events such as 2022 floods, recurring heatwaves, and droughts.
- Urban building collapse and flooding due to rapid urbanization.
- Industrial disasters.
- Public health emergencies such as COVID-19.



Sindh Emergency Rescue Service (Rescue 1122)



Vision

Safer communities where all citizens are provided the right to timely emergency response and care without discrimination.

Mission

Establishment of an effective system for emergency preparedness, response, protection & prevention, while contributing towards building socially responsible, healthy, resilient and safer communities.



Sindh Emergency Rescue Service (Rescue 1122)



- Unified "one-window" service
 for all types of emergencies and
 disasters through one-dial
 helpline "1122".
- Operationalized in May 2022 through World Bank support.
- "The Sindh Emergency Rescue Service Act, 2023" notified in August 2023, officially making Rescue 1122 part of the Government of Sindh.





Rescue 1122 Services





<u>Medical Emergency Response:</u> Provides advanced life support and medical care during emergencies.



<u>Fire Fighting Service:</u> Responds to fire emergencies and conducts technical rescue operations.



<u>Water Rescue Service:</u> Performs rescues in water body calamities such as floods or drowning incidents.



<u>Urban Search and Rescue:</u> Locates and rescues victims trapped in collapsed buildings or other disaster zones.





<u>Community Awareness and Training:</u> Provides community disaster preparedness training (First Aid, Search and Rescue) at school and community levels.



Command and Control Center







- Operational 24/7 with call operators and wireless Operators.
- Oversees communication for entire province and responds to 10,000+ calls per day.
- Fully integrated with key entities including District Administration and Law Enforcement Agencies.
- Priority Dispatch System used to dispatch emergency rescue vehicles for efficiency and accuracy.







Rescue 1122's Impact



Impact of Rescue 1122 in two years















Safer communities where all citizens are provided the right to timely emergency response and care without discrimination.



Enhanced preparedness to respond to emergencies



- Operational across whole province with 6 divisional HQs and 13 district stations. 16 satellite stations across main highway also under operationalization.
- As soon as an advisory or alert regarding any natural disaster is initiated by the National/Provincial Disaster Management Agency, the Central Command & Control of Sindh Emergency Rescue Service declares a state of emergency: 50% of operational staff are mobilized to the affected areas and establish on ground operational command post and camps.
- Joint exercises and drills are conducted on a regular basis at local government and community levels, especially for flood emergencies.



Gender inclusion at Rescue 1122





Imperative of women in the rescue service



Rescue 1122's Goal: Increase women rescuers & staff to 30% from 13% by 2028.

Improved access to survivors

Cultural sensitivities exist in emergencies for women and children. Women responders can better gain access and build trust, ensuring they receive necessary support.

Stronger team through diversity

Women bring unique perspectives, skills, and experiences to the team - **enhancing problem-solving and decision-making** during critical situations.

Inspiring the community

Seeing women in vital roles **challenges traditional stereotypes and empowers young girls**. More women can also confidently seek help from emergency services.





Challenges of gender inclusion for Rescue 1122



Low female labor force participation

 Only 21 percent of working age women are employed in Pakistan—far lower compared to countries at a similar level of development, which average 58 percent.

Mobility limitations

- Commuting long distances without male family members can be a challenge.
 Safety concerns are an obstacle.
- Rescue academy facilities are in Lahore (1200km away), in another province.

Social norms

Social norms around housework and childcare persist – research shows
women are also more likely to participate in the labor force if men in the
household agree that women should be allowed to work outside the home.



Initiatives to recruit more women



Gender sensitive recruitment and mobilization

- Separate female advertisements (180 positions currently under recruitment).
- Advertisements shared with universities/colleges.
- · Social media campaigns.
- Discussions with parents and male family members for candidates who qualified for training.

Training module modification and incentive creation

- Modified training modules from 6 months to 4 months.
- 25% additional allowance provided during training period to support their families.

Establishment of rescue academy in Karachi, Sindh

- Encourages more women to take part in training (no need to travel far to Lahore).
- Academy also includes hostels specifically for women.






Women in Rescue 1122 service increased to 13%.

78 women working in key roles including emergency officers, EMTs, control center officers, station desk officers, paramedics and rescuers.

Referral pathways for gender-based violence, sexual harassment, sexual exploitation and abuse



Key Considerations: Confidentiality, Survivor-Centered Approach, Cultural Sensitivity

Receive call at Rescue 1122

Initial intake and assessment

Immediate safety assessment

Determine immediate risk and safety. If immediate danger, dispatch emergency services (i.e., police, medical)




Initial response
